		Signs And Posters In Work Vehicles Used To Remind To Practise Good Hygiene Relevant posters and signs displayed to remind employees of the need to wash hands for at least 20 seconds on a frequent basis.  Also signs to remind employees to practice good respiratory hygiene - catching of coughing and sneezes and correct disposal of tissues followed by hand washing.  Use Of Face Coverings Face coverings are provided for use on every job.  Face coverings are not classed as PPE. Advice will be given to employees on the correct use.  Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water for 20seconds or use hand sanitiser before putting a face-covering on, and after removing it.  When wearing a face covering, avoid touching your face or face covering, as you could contaminate them with germs from your hands. 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# **Operating procedures**

In the context of COVID-19 this means working through these steps in order:

No one is obliged to work in an unsafe environment. If you are concerned that any member of the household is displaying symptoms of COVID-19 you should not continue with the job and should report this back to the team leader.

Social distancing must be maintained wherever possible. Where it is not possible contact time must be limited to an absolute minimum or the job should not go ahead.

Ensure frequent handwashing, use of sanitiser, gloves and facecovering before, during and after every home visit.

Ensure vehicles are regularly cleaned with appropriate products

Keep contact with objects within the home to an absolute minimum

Ahead of the visit, request that all access doors are left open to minimise contact with handles

Keep activity time at each job to as short as possible


No work must be carried out in homes where someone has symptoms unless to remedy a direct risk to the safety of the household


Face to face contact with anyone in the 'vulnerable' category (shielding) must be avoided

Keep a copy of this risk assessment in the van and be prepared to share it with customers

#### **Risk rating explanation**

Risk ratings are calculated by considering the likelihood of an event occurring along with the severity of the potential consequence should an accident occur. After considering existing control measures, values are assigned to the likelihood and severity from the scales below and these figures multiplied to established the risk rating.





## What do your risk ratings mean?

- Risk is categorised as LOW: Look to reduce risk if practicable
- Risk has been categorised as MEDIUM: Begin to plan your action to reduce the risk immediately
- Risk has been categorised as HIGH: Immediate action required to reduce the risk
